Kumamoto Prefecture has a population of about 1.7 million people and a vast array of commercial and cultural facilities. Located in the center of the southern island of Kyushu, the region features vast natural forests and seaside areas, and an impressive volume of groundwater resources. These groundwater resources provide a wide variety of safe, fresh local foods and beverages to enjoy.

The city center's robust public transit system, consisting of trams and buses, makes both commuting and travel quite convenient. As a smaller city, goods are cheaper than in massive metropolises like Tokyo and Osaka, making it an affordable home for foreign students.

Furthermore, a plethora of shopping malls, libraries, museums, sports facilities, and other essential lifestyle amenities offer diverse experiences comparable to larger urban centers.

Kumamoto maintains a careful balance between nature and urban functionality, making it an ideal study abroad location not only for learning but also just as a great place to live.

Moreover, companies in the global semiconductor industry are building factories here after a major semiconductor company establishing a base of operations in Kumamoto. This year, the number of foreigners working in Kumamoto has increased by 25.5% compared to last year (a new record high).









Food
